STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On June 16, 2005, Petitioner filed a Request to Revoke Respondent's Sales Tax License. On November 28, 2005, the parties in this matter entered into a Stipulation, whereby the revocation would be held in abeyance as long as Respondent made specified payments toward the tax delinquency and remained current on his tax filings. The Stipulation provided that in the event Respondent failed to meet these conditions the license would be revoked without further hearing, upon the submission of an affidavit by Petitioner. On October 5, 2006, Petitioner submitted an Affidavit of (X). (X) sworn statements indicate that Respondent failed to comply with the terms of the Stipulation.

An Order to Show Cause was issued on October 17, 2006, ordering Respondent to show cause within ten days why the license should not be revoked. Respondent failed to submit any response to the Order.
